

3 Above the sofa in the sitting room is a painting by contemporary British artist Danny Fox, which fitted in the space perfectly. The sofa is covered in a discontinued French weave inspired by the work of the painter Joan Miró and the walls are painted in '4-049' from Papers and Paints.
